2. **Budget and Neighborhood Dues:** (John W) Budget listed on the <u>Gulf Park Website(http://gulfpark.net/</u>). Purpose of dues: Lights (\$2,300), Front Entrance mowing and landscaping, signs, and operating expenses. We have approximately 23 lights. Dues collection this year were at 46.4% of the community. Routine expenses for this year are budgeted for \$4,200. There is room in the budget to put about \$5,000 into a project for new entrance signs.

## **Old Business:**

- 1. Use PayPal, Venmo or a check to pay your dues (John). Instructions for using the Paypal or Venmo App is posted on the <u>Gulf Park Website</u>. Please note that if you pay by PayPal, please choose the "Friends & Family" option for Payment Type so no extra fees are incurred".
- 2. **Signage** (John): Still looking into signage for Sanders and Bob Gray Roads. Contacted the County and they now say that signs cannot go in the right of way and must be 10 feet away from the right of way. We are investigating both the legal and financial aspects of this project. Our last major project was the addition of fire hydrants in Gulf Park, in the early '80s.

The hope is to purchase signage for the remaining **8** entrances.

We would probably start with Tallahassee/Sanders and either Cedar Grove or Delray on Bob Gray.

A vote was taken on signage and the consensus was for a dark base.

- GPCA Bylaws:
  - XI. (1) The election of officers shall be held annually at the January General Meeting.
  - (2) No officer may be elected to the same office consecutively but may again be elected to the same office after an interval of one year.
  - (3) To be a duly constituted executive officer, the person must receive a majority of the votes of those present at the annual election meeting.
  - (4) The elected officers will take office at the end of the January General Meeting.
